Dear Deputy

In light of the ongoing debate about the Justice Seamus Woulfe saga and the fact that Justice Minister Helen McEntee is facing questions in the Dáil, we felt it was appropriate to draw your personal attention to the fact that we have been trying for well over a year now, to simply elicit an acknowledgement or a response from Minister McEntee and from her predecessor Charles Flanagan, to a formal request to the Committee on Public Petitions for a Part 2 Enquiry under *the Houses of the Oireachtas (Inquiries, Privileges & Procedures) Act 2013*. All of the criteria has been stringently met, including the provision of all relevant materials under the respective rules, which have been dispatched in the form of online digital reports and other publications sent directly to the Minister 'under seal' by recorded or registered post – and copied to the Attorney General and the Presidents of the domestic Courts for the avoidance of doubt – and which said publications contain irrefutable evidence of repeat, systemic, criminal activity by a number of senior officials and office holders, including judges, most notably by Fine-Gael appointees, but that all of our efforts to elicit a simple acknowledgement or response to date from the Minister(s) for Justice, have been totally, utterly and unlawfully ignored.

For your perusal, and in context of your particular role as a representative of the sovereign people of Ireland with a lawful duty to ensure that the people are not being caused harm or loss due to unlawful or indeed criminal activity such as has been repeatedly outlined to the respective Justice Ministers without acknowledgement or response; we attach our most recent 'under seal' 1-page letter to the Minister, which likewise, has gone unanswered and unacknowledged.

In face of this unlawful stonewalling, we feel we have no other option but to respectfully place all sitting members of the 33<sup>rd</sup> Dáil formally 'on constructive Notice' of our now-longstanding application to the Legislature for a Part 2 Enquiry on the matters raised in the said documentation, and asking for confirmation from you that you have received this alert and will personally enquire as to the status of our formal Application & Petition for an Enquiry Into State-Sponsored Criminality.

Please consider Deputy the amount of time and sincere intentions that have been invested in this matter to date by a great number of concerned citizens, and please return to us with any assurances or commentary on the aforesaid matter, as well as the attached '*Formal Notice & Assertion of Lawful Rights & Authorities According to the Rule of Law*'.

Any and all materials will be forwarded on request. For the avoidance of any doubt Senator, the deadline for responses to the attached 'QTC 5' Notice (which was also ignored by the respective authorities served) is further extended to Friday December 4<sup>th</sup> 2020.
